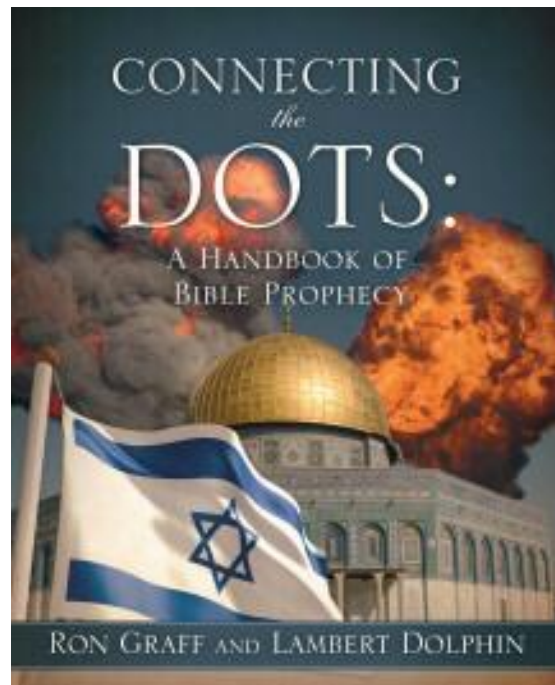

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Introduction: How to Use This Study Guide

Personal Enrichment

Plan to devote time to this study five days each week. This is much more effective than trying to do a whole week's worth of study at one time. Each day refers to just a few pages in your book. The starting point may not be the top of a page but one of the headings on the page. (If you are using the Kindle or other electronic book, search for that day's "starting point." It will usually be the second occurrence of the words given as a starting point since the first occurrence will usually be in the Table of Contents.)

The key to Bible study is personal application. James told his readers

²² But be doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving yourselves. ²³ For if anyone is a hearer of the word and not a doer, he is like a man observing his natural face in a mirror; ²⁴ for he observes himself, goes away, and immediately forgets what kind of man he was. ²⁵ But he who looks into the perfect law of liberty and continues in it, and is not a forgetful hearer but a doer of the work, this one will be blessed in what he does.

James 1:22-25

Visualize: After reading the day's assignment, take a little time to make it meaningful to you. Use your imagination to picture what the information might mean to you or to others.

Summarize: Record a summary of your thoughts while they are fresh in your mind. Use the space provided. Jot down other thoughts you have during this time in the margins of your study guide. This will help you participate in the group discussions, and will be a valuable record of your thoughts and spiritual growth.

Personalize: Even if you don't have a lot of time, make these thoughts personal by writing a short prayer that you can offer to the Lord about them. Writing prayers may be a new idea to you, but this practice is helpful to capture the essence of what you have learned, and when you sincerely offer these thoughts to the Lord, you will find that they keep your daily prayers from becoming repetitious rituals.

Group Study

Small groups have proven to be the best way for most believers to develop close relationships and stimulate one another in their spiritual growth (Hebrews 10:24-25). They usually meet every week or two in homes or small meeting rooms. They often include refreshments, a time for socializing, a half-hour or more of discussion time, and a dedicated time of prayer, including intercession for one another's requests.

Someone in your group should be appointed leader for the session. It can be the same person each week, or it could be rotated. The leader may begin the discussion time by calling the group together, and asking *some* of the discussion questions. Most groups will *not have the time to thoroughly discuss all of the suggested questions*. Of course, the leader or others in the group could also pose their own questions. Members of the group may encourage others by reading one of the summary prayers that they have written,

What Jewish Festival was being observed at the "Last Supper"? How did Jesus institute the practice of Communion (The Lord's Supper) during this meal?

What new significance did the Festivals of Unleavened Bread and Firstfruits have for those who recognized Jesus as Messiah?

What Jewish Festival was being observed when God sent the "gift" Jesus had promised to the disciples? (Acts 2:1-6)

What future significance might the Holy Days of Rosh Hashanah, Yom Kippur, and the Feast of Tabernacles hold for believers in Jesus the Messiah?

Is it wise to set dates for future events, such as the Rapture? Why or why not?

What is the relationship between Israel and the Church? Has the Church replaced Israel? Why or why not?

How do the messages to the Seven Churches in Revelation chapters 2 and 3 depict seven periods of Church history?

Are there still examples of all seven kinds of churches in the world today?

Which (one or two) of the seven churches characterize our times the most?

Has Jesus been present with his Church during these seven periods of Church History? Is he present with us now? Explain.

Visualize: 2 Corinthians 11:14 says "Satan himself masquerades as an angel of light." One of the most powerful secret societies was the Masonic order called the "Illuminati." The name means "Holders of

the light,” and was derived from the name “Lucifer.” How do you picture this organization working to gain control over world governments?

DISCUSSION – Group Participation

Discuss one or more of these questions. You could also use the questions given in each day's "Visualize" exercise. *This section involves so much information that your group may want to spend more time on it.*

Adam and Eve's son Cain built the first city. Was Cain godly or rebellious? Why do you think he built a city?

After the Flood, one of Noah's great-grandsons, Nimrod, built cities like Nineveh and Babylon. Was this a good thing? What does it tell us about human government?

What were the four great world empires that existed from the time of Nebuchadnezzar until now?

According to Nebuchadnezzar's dream and Daniel's vision, will there be another human world empire? Will it be godly or ungodly?

What event will bring about the establishment of God's Millennial Kingdom?

The last head of the seven-headed dragon in Revelation 12, 13, 17, and 18 stands for a final human empire. Could this empire be the European Union that is growing in power today? Could it be another organization of nations?

What are some of the powerful organizations that have promoted a world government in the past? Are some of them still around today?

Powerful people may have different reasons for supporting the cause of global governance. What would be some "good" reasons? What would be some "bad" reasons? Could some of these people have good intentions but be contributing to an evil purpose – an invention that will go wrong?

What effect do major problems in the world have on shaping people's willingness to accept world governance? Consider the 911 terrorist attacks, the economic collapse of 2008, and the tsunami/nuclear reactor melt-downs in Japan in 2011.

What freedoms will people be willing to give up in order to have greater safety and comfort?

How might the world-wide economic malaise make people willing to accept the “Mark of the Beast?”

What are two important future events that will take place after the rapture of the Church but before Jesus returns as King of Kings?

What is the significance of the fact that the events of the Tribulation revolve around Israel and Jewish believers and the Church is not mentioned during that period of time?

Historical Developments
